January 5, 2024

Candidate of Phil. Sc., academician of the International Eurasian Academy of Television and Radio Manshuk Mukasheva and Candidate of Phil. Sc., Assoc. Prof. Oryntai Oshanova exchanged views with Chinese colleagues on general scientific areas.



KazNU scientists met with teachers of the University's School of Journalism and New Media and gave lectures to students. They also discussed with the heads of the schools of journalism and new media the issues of future exchange of students, undergraduates studying at the bachelor's and master's degrees in the academic mobility program.



In addition, the parties worked out opportunities for teachers to undergo scientific internships, jointly conduct scientific research and publish scientific articles and academic papers.

Jiaotong University, which was visited by KazNU scientists by special invitation, is a unique educational institution that is part of the elite association of higher educational institutions of China with a high rating.



CHEMICAL RESEARCH AND PRODUCTION CENTER

January 15, 2024

As part of the 90th anniversary celebrations of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, a scientific-production center called Chemical Coating Innovations has been established on the university campus. The center focuses on the production of chemical coatings for various purposes and applications.





The grand opening of the center was attended by Darkhan Ahmed-Zaki, Vice Minister of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Kazakhstan, and Dr. Prof. Zhanseit Tuimebayev, Chairman of the Board and Rector of KazNU, along with doctoral scientists, professors, and young researchers.

This scientific-production center was established with financial support from the Science Fund of the Ministry of Science and Higher Education. Scientists at the center produce both traditional and specialized coatings for the needs of mechanical engineering, instrumentation, as well as for the souvenir and jewelry industries.

Rector Tuimebayev emphasized, "The galvanic coatings produced at KazNU extend the service life of products, benefiting both manufacturers and consumers. This is a new and effective way to protect against rust. Additionally, the new center will train technologists and operators of electrochemical production."

Dr. Alina Galiyeva, head of the Chemical Coating Innovations center, presented the new project to the attendees, stating, "In Kazakhstan, the production of electrochemical coatings is currently not in the best state. There are practically no such scientific-production centers. Electrochemical coatings are the most convenient and practical in terms of properties and cost. At our center, we have installed zinc, nickel, and copper plating lines. The total capacity of these lines allows us to produce tens of thousands of square meters of coating per year. The center plans to develop technologies for obtaining and applying coatings that protect against various aggressive environments.

The implementation of the project is based on the real demand of the industrial sector. The machine-building plant for railway automation, JSC SP "Kazelectroprivod," has ordered technologies and services for obtaining protective coatings applied according to international standards. Previously, a whole complex of electrochemical technologies was developed at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, from which the "Technology for obtaining electrolytic coatings for various purposes" was proposed for commercialization.



JOINT CENTER OF KAZNU AND XINJIANG MEDICAL UNIVERSITY

January 18, 2024

A delegation from Xinjiang Medical University, led by Mr. Lu Chen, Director of the First Affiliated Hospital, visited Al-Farabi Kazakh National University.





Dr. Zhamila Aitzhanova, Member of the Management Board and Vice-Rector for Scientific and Innovative Activities, greeted the delegation. The dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Healthcare, Dr. Raushan Issayeva, shared insights into the faculty's activities, emphasizing its openness to collaboration and integration with colleagues from China and the implementation of innovations for the benefit of the health and quality of life of Kazakhstanis. Mr. Lu Chen proposed the establishment of a joint specialized medical center in nephrology. He also expressed readiness to support the provision of necessary equipment to advance the work of small-scale production of innovative products based on plant materials at the Research Center for Medicinal Plants.

The parties also discussed prospects for staff and faculty exchange programs, professional development courses for faculty members, academic meetings, symposiums, and other issues.



EXPANDING PARTNERSHIP WITH EUROPEAN UNIVERSITIES

parties exchanged views on further strengthening their partnership.





In turn, Tobias Studemann, Director of the Eastern European Office, expressed gratitude to the university leadership and expressed a desire to continue enhancing cooperation.




INTRODUCTION OF ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY TECHNOLOGIES

January 23, 2024



Scientists of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University implements the project "Introduction of environmentally friendly energy production technologies at Kazakhstani thermal power plants". The aim of the project is to reduce emissions of harmful substances into the atmosphere.

A team of scientists has developed and proposed an innovative technology for two-stage combustion of high-ash Kazakh coal at Kazakhstani thermal power plants. Using state-of-the-art information technologies and 3D computer modeling methods, they have conducted research on heat and mass transfer processes and the formation of harmful substances in the combustion chamber of the BKZ-75 boiler at the operating Shakhtinskaya Thermal Power Plant.



The research results enable efficient control of fuel combustion processes in real energy installations with necessary adjustments to various parameters. They also enable the identification of optimal design solutions for burner devices, the creation of optimal methods for burning high-ash coal, and the minimization of harmful particulate gas emissions into the atmosphere. Scientists have proposed optimal methods for minimizing emissions of carbon oxides (COx) and nitrogen oxides (NOx) into the atmosphere.



A SCIENTIFIC AND INNOVATION EXHIBITION IN URUMQI, CHINA

January 26, 2024

On January 22nd, 2024, Al-Farabi KazNU organized its first scientific and innovation

exhibition in Urumqi, People's Republic of China.





The event, hosted by the Ministry of Education of the PRC, brought together 196 rectors and heads of research centers from local universities, representatives from over 600 Chinese universities, leaders of 40 major industrial enterprises, diplomatic corps of both countries, scientists, and entrepreneurs.

A particularly keen interest in KazNU's scientific and innovation projects was shown by the Chinese delegation led by Vice Minister of Education of the PRC, Mr. Sun Yao, Vice Chairman of the Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference, and Secretary of the Party Committee of Xinjiang University, Mr. Xue Xiani.

During the extensive event, Vice Minister of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Kazakhstan, Darkhan Ahmed-Zaki, KazNU Rector and Chairman of the Board, Dr. Prof. Zhanseit Tuimebayev, and 30 KazNU scientists participated. The international exhibition, organized by KazNU, showcased patented scientific and innovative projects undergoing commercialization.



The Chemical Coating Innovations Research Center, specializing in chemical galvanic coating production, opened as part of KazNU's 90th anniversary celebrations, presented its products at the exhibition. KazNU scientists also introduced bioactive additives and herbal teas, new antibacterial drugs for treating sturgeon fish, and a nano-spacecraft, assembled and launched into space for the first time at KazNU.

An innovative "ALFASAT" construction set for space robotics development and STEM education systems in educational institutions was demonstrated. Scientists from the Vascular Pathology Center at the university presented a new device and innovative method for restoring arterial blood vessel permeability.

The exhibition was followed by an international scientific symposium of universities from Kazakhstan and China. Symposium participants discussed common goals and directions for cooperation in education and science, issues related to the commercialization of KazNU's scientific projects, and shared experiences.

The Chinese side emphasized the importance of developing partnerships between scholars from both countries and the relevance of KazNU's innovative projects. Following the KazNU delegation's working visit to Urumqi, bilateral memorandums were signed with Xinjiang University of the People's Republic of China in the fields of chemistry and chemical engineering, law, information technology, remote sensing of the Earth, and academic and scientific cooperation. An agreement on mutual understanding was also reached with Xinjiang Pedagogical University for the opening of a joint research center for Sino-Kazakh universities, and a memorandum was signed with Xinjiang Normal University.



COLLABORATION AGREEMENT WITH XINJIANG INSTITUTE OF ECOLOGY AND GEOGRAPHY OF THE CHINESE ACADEMY OF SCIENCES

February 1, 2024

Al-Farabi KazNU and the Xinjiang Institute of Ecology and Geography of the Chinese Academy of Sciences have entered into a collaboration agreement.



During a meeting between KazNU Rector Prof. Zhanseit Tuimebayev and the Director-General of the Xinjiang Institute of Ecology and Geography, Zhang Yuanmin, opinions were exchanged on the development of cooperation directions and further joint work.



The agreement envisages the expansion of cooperation in the field of environmental sciences and sustainable development, as well as the joint use of scientific centers and laboratories in educational institutions. Additionally, this memorandum will facilitate the exchange of faculty and students, the organization of joint academic meetings, symposiums, and the arrangement of professional development courses for the faculty. Articles, reports, and other scientific works by faculty and students will be published in periodic and scientific publications of partner educational institutions. The agreement also includes the development and implementation of joint educational programs, including dual-degree programs. Furthermore, joint participation in grants announced by state, international, public, private funds, and organizations is foreseen.



SHAPING A NEW ERA OF THE DIGITAL INDUSTRY

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University participates in the VI digital forum Digital Almaty 2024, presenting innovative startup projects of university scientists.



The VI International digital Forum Digital Almaty 2024 brought together government officials of the SCO and EAEU countries, leading experts and entrepreneurs to share experiences and ideas aimed at shaping a new era of the digital industry. Participants discussed the topics of digital transformation in industry and innovative solutions in the fields of GovTech, Industry 4.0, ESG, Smart City, share fresh cases from leading experts, and present projects at the exhibition of

innovative technologies.



Al-Farabi Kazakh National University presented startup projects: "Modernization of digital tourism content: mobile applications, panoramic 3d tours, interactive maps and QR codes", "Innovative designer of small spacecraft for STEM education", "Water monitoring system based on artificial intelligence and the Internet of Things" and others. The TOURISMQAZ mobile application developed by scientists is an automated system for managing customer (tourist) relationships with suppliers of the main categories of tourist services – transport, accommodation, meals, tour guides, instructors and translators, entertainment and others.

It is noteworthy that the research center and the institute plan to organize an international conference on scientific research at KazNU.

According to the plan, a hospital will be built on campus. The medical center will include a polyclinic, a faculty of medicine, and healthcare facilities. In this context, I propose to establish a medical center jointly with Hyundae Hospital in this building," the rector said.

In turn, Kim Bu Sop thanked Zhanseit Tuimebayev for the warm welcome and expressed support for the initiatives outlined by the rector.



"South Korea ranks among the top three in the world in terms of medicine. Currently, the country is diligently working on further developing this field. I believe that in the future, it is necessary to hold joint scientific conferences, symposiums, and meetings," said the honorary guest. BIOFERTILIZERS TO COMBAT SOIL SALINIZATION

February 11, 2024

Young scientists at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University have developed biofertilizers based on low-grade coal and coal-solubilizing bacteria.

The main objective of the project is to address soil salinization issues in Kazakhstan and to utilize low-grade coal.



Experts at the Kazakh-German-Chinese International Research Laboratory of Applied Microbiology have produced the product in two forms: liquid and powder. These fertilizers are environmentally friendly, not only enhancing agricultural productivity but also posing no harm to humans or the environment. Soil salinization is a significant global environmental problem that adversely affects soil health and plant productivity. Currently, the traditional method of addressing this problem involves using fertilizers based on chemical synthesis. However, despite yielding good, effective results, this method negatively impacts the soil. In contrast, KazNU's product is safe and beneficial not only for the economy but also for the agricultural sector.

At present, scientists are continuing their research on this project. In the near future, production of biofertilizers will be established. Recently, scientists have signed a contract for the commercialization of the project.



INTERNATIONAL ROUND TABLE ON SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

February 13, 2024

The international round table "Sustainable development through the prism of corporate, environmental and social responsibility: today and tomorrow" was held at the Al-Farabi Kazakh National University.



Organized by the Department of Management at the Higher School of Economics and Business in collaboration with partners, the event aimed to facilitate the exchange of experiences and best practices in corporate responsibility, discuss the impact of environmental and social programs on business and society, and develop strategies for enhancing sustainable development in various countries.



The roundtable featured participation from international experts from the USA, the UK, Poland, Finland, and Russia, as well as representatives from the administration and faculty of Al-Farabi KazNU, along with students from the university.

The Vice-rector for Scientific and Innovative Activities of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, Doctor of Economics, Professor Zhamila Aitzhanova addressed the participants of the meeting with a welcoming speech. They discuss issues and share experiences in the field of higher education and science. I am sure that the work of the round table today will be productive and will yield significant results."

The participants of the round table discussed the most important factors affecting business responsibility within the framework of ESG standards for achieving Sustainable Development Goals.

Designed to monitor environmental issues like water scarcity, drought, and land degradation exacerbated by climate change, the laboratory utilizes remote sensing technology to ensure environmental security and sustainable development. It serves as a beacon of international cooperation, fostering a high-tech platform for resource research in Kazakhstan, China, and Central Asia.





Situated within KazNU's Faculty of Geography and Nature Management, the joint laboratory stands as the sole natural resource monitoring center in Central Asia. Beyond its role in scientific research, it serves as a pivotal hub for promoting sustainable environmental development in the region.

The signing of an agreement between KazNU and Xinjiang Institute of Ecology and Geography marked a pivotal moment in the laboratory's establishment, symbolizing a commitment to advancing scientific cooperation.

With KazNU allocating and refurbishing a 500-square-meter space for the laboratory, and China providing funding of 55 million tenge (approximately 1 million yuan) for equipment, the joint endeavor is poised to make significant strides in environmental research and collaboration between the two nations.

The Department of Theory and History of State and Law, Constitutional and Administrative Law together with the Farabi Reading Club at the Al-Farabi Library organized the exhibition.



KAZAKH-CHINESE EDUCATIONAL COLLABORATION

March 27, 2024

Dr. Prof. Zhanseit Tuimebayev, Chairman of the Board and Rector of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, conducted substantive discussions with Yerkin Tuniyaz, Chairman of the People's Government of Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region of the People's Republic of China (PRC), during his official visit to the university.





Accompanied by dignitaries including Vice Minister of Science and Higher Education Talgat Yeshenkulov and Zhang Yuanming, Director General of Xinjiang Institute of Ecology and Geography, the meeting focused on enhancing collaboration in scientific research, academic mobility programs, and joint initiatives between KazNU and Chinese universities.

Vice Minister Yeshenkulov highlighted ongoing efforts to utilize scientific laboratories jointly with Chinese counterparts and promote academic exchanges. Tuniyaz emphasized the importance of KazNU's collaboration with Chinese universities, citing the establishment of the "Remote Sensing Technology and Applications" joint laboratory at KazNU as a testament to proactive engagement.

Senior Advisers on Non-participating Countries at the Department of International Cooperation of the European Organization for Nuclear Research (CERN) Christoph Schaefer and Tadeusz Kurtyka have repeatedly visited Kazakhstan, in particular, they came as lecturers and members of the organizing committee of the summer school on high energy physics and accelerator technology in 2019, which was held in Almaty. Both took part in the process of preparing the signing of a cooperation agreement between the Government of the Republic of Kazakhstan and CERN.






II FORUM OF RECTORS OF HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS OF KAZAKHSTAN AND RUSSIA

March 29, 2024

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University hosted the II Forum of Rectors of Higher Education Institutions of Kazakhstan and Russia on March 29, 2024, attracting prominent figures from







Under the theme "Current Trends in Higher Education and Science," the international forum convened key stakeholders including Sayasat Nurbek, Minister of Science and Higher Education of Kazakhstan, and Konstantin Mogilevsky, Deputy Minister of Science and Higher Education of the Russian Federation. Also in attendance were Vladimir Shevchenko, Rector of the National Nuclear Research University MEPHI, and Dr. Prof. Zhanseit Tuimebayev, Chairman of the Board and Rector of KazNU, alongside rectors from 50 universities in Russia and 40 universities in Kazakhstan.

The forum aimed to fortify ties between educational institutions in both countries, fostering mutually beneficial relationships and advancing the internationalization of higher education. Discussions centered on expanding academic mobility for students and faculty, enhancing cooperation in scientific research, and exploring avenues for collaborative development.

Minister Nurbek lauded the enduring and fruitful cooperation between Kazakhstan and Russia in science and higher education, underscoring the importance of such forums in strengthening bilateral relations.

During the proceedings, Rector Shevchenko presented proposals for further enhancing collaboration between the two nations in science and education, setting the stage for productive deliberations.

Noteworthy outcomes of the forum included the signing of agreements to establish a branch of Mendeleev Russian Chemical Technology University at Dulati Taraz Regional University, and to facilitate joint education programs between KazNU and St. Petersburg State University within the CIS Network University framework.

Following these significant agreements, the forum proceeded to engage in focused discussions within various thematic sections, further deepening collaboration and paving the way for future initiatives in Kazakh-Russian academic cooperation.



BRIQUETTED COAL, WHICH REDUCES THE DANGER OF CARBON MONOXIDE SMOKE

April 8, 2024

This innovative project will help reduce the amount of smoke and harmful sulfur contained in coal.



The products prepared by KazNU scientists will not only solve environmental problems, but will also be effective for Kazakhstani production. Because our country does not produce high-quality briquetted coal. According to laboratory scientists, this type of coal enters the country from China and Russia.



"70% of the coal mined in Kazakhstan is low-grade coal. The quality of low-grade coal is poor. During the research, it was found that coal contains a large amount of harmful sulfur. Later, we made briquetted coal by adding sulfur—reducing bacteria to this low-grade coal," says a junior researcher at the Kazakh-German-Chinese International Research Laboratory of Applied Microbiology of KazNU. Bio-briquettes can be used in the food industry, thermal power plants, outdoors, etc.

"Currently, the population is not fully provided with natural gas in most localities. Because of this, people burn low-grade coal to heat a private house in winter. As a result, they are poisoned by carbon monoxide and die. Therefore, the goal of our project is to improve the quality of low-grade coal and reduce the amount of smoke emitted during coal combustion," says Damir Asanovich.



DISCUSSION OF TOPICAL ISSUES OF THE MODERN ECONOMY

April 8, 2024

The international scientific and practical conference "The paradigm of sustainable economic development in the context of global change: challenges, consequences, opportunities" was held at the Al-Farabi Kazakh National University within the framework of the II International Farabi Forum.

Two special vending machines for plastic bottles and aluminum cans from Sparklo Kazakhstan have appeared at the al-Farabi Kazakh National University.



These devices are located on the campus as part of the implementation of SDG 12 "Ensuring the transition to rational consumption and production models". Fandomats are installed near the rector's office and in the student service center "Keremet".

Now any student can easily hand over used bottles and cans to Sparklomat, which uses state-of-the-art barcode recognition technology using artificial intelligence. To do this, you just need to register in the Sparkle Rewards Club mobile application, which is available for download on Google Play and the App Store.



The machine accepts bottles and cans with a volume of up to 2 liters, without liquid. For each container delivered, there is an opportunity to receive bonuses that can be accumulated and exchanged for various promotions and offers from partners.

The collected packages are sent to processing plants, where they are further processed and used in the production of new packages, clothing, shoes, furniture, building materials and other products. Together we take care of our planet and make the world cleaner and greener!

The conference was dedicated to SDG

11, which is "Ensuring Open, Secure, Resilient and Sustainable Cities and Human Settlements". This goal has become the basis for a new urban agenda.

The large-scale event gathered together leading scientists and experts from different countries in the fields of geography, sustainable development, and urban planning. Participants included representatives from the United Kingdom, Russia, Belarus, and Kyrgyzstan, as well as professors and doctors of science from leading educational institutions and research institutes.

The conference "Urban Sustainability: Challenges and Solutions" provides a unique opportunity for the exchange of knowledge and experience in the field of sustainable urban development. It aims to analyze the current challenges and find effective solutions based on research and practical experience. The forum also focuses on the rational, careful, and safe use of natural resources in order to achieve sustainable urban development.

The opening ceremony was attended by representatives from various organizations and individuals, including:

- The National Commission for Women and Family and Demographic Policy under the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan.
- Managing partner of Kazakh-American University.
- Entrepreneur and founder of YASSA education platform, Alina Abdrakhmanova.
- Chairman of the board of JSC Institute of Geography and Water Security, Ministry of Internal Affairs, and academician of the National Academy of Science, Akhmetkal Medeu.
- Dean of the faculty of geography and environmental management at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, Aliya Aktymbayeva.

The program of the two-day conference includes plenary and breakout sessions, master classes, and an introduction to poster presentations. The participants will discuss topics related to the socio-economic aspects of sustainable development, the use of GIS technologies to study urban processes, as well as demographic issues.

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KAZNU SCIENTISTS INVESTIGATE FLOODING IN WESTERN KAZAKHSTAN

April 20, 2024

Researchers at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University are studying the flood situation in Western Kazakhstan as part of a megagrant project titled "Sustainable Development of Natural-Economic and Socio-Economic Systems of West Kazakhstan Region in the Context of Green Growth."



To manage the flood conditions in the Zhaiyk River basin in Atyrau, an operational response headquarters has been established under the Ministry of Science and Higher Education's Committee of Science. A team, including senior lecturer Almat Erdesbay from the Faculty of Geography and Nature Management, assessed the current flood situation.

The scientists conducted various studies, including calculation, graph-analytical, hydrological, and field research using hydrometric turntables, UAV echo sounders, and GNSS receivers. These studies aimed to evaluate infrastructure status, channel capacity, and potential measures for handling peak flow rates in the Zhaiyk River branches.

A comprehensive analysis of hydrological data, including the timing of water run-up and flood waves, was conducted. Cross-sectional profiles were created and analyzed for gauging stations along the Zhaiyk River. Recommendations were provided on the timing of maximum water discharge reaching Atyrau and the flow capacity of the channels based on available data and field surveys.

Since April 20, KazNU scientists have been conducting field research in the West Kazakhstan region. They found significant flooding in the neighborhoods of Aktobe city, affecting settlements like "Lokomotiv," "Vesna," and "Stroitel-4," among others. Water levels rose by 2-3 meters, causing damage to fences, roads, gas pipelines, and trees. A multi-rotor drone and space imagery were used for a comparative analysis.

Additionally, physical and chemical studies of Ilek River water samples revealed an excess of harmful suspended solids.



STRENGTHENING TIES WITH UK UNIVERSITIES

April 23, 2024

A delegation of British universities visited Al-Farabi Kazakh National University in order to establish partnerships in the fields of science and educational development. The delegation included representatives from universities such as Abertay University in Great Britain, Ulster University and South Bank University in London, Queen Margaret University in Ireland, Charles Sturt University in Australia, Niagara College in Canada, and Polytechnic Institute of Saskatchewan.





In addition to the exchange of students and internships, three professors from KazNU were invited to deliver lectures and provide scientific guidance for PhD students within the framework of the program "Attracting Foreign Specialists to Universities in Kazakhstan" in 2022. Joint research projects and the supervision of doctoral students are important components of KazNU's collaboration with universities in the United Kingdom. To develop this area of collaboration, the governments of both countries have established the Newton-Al-Farabi Partnership Program, which aims to strengthen the scientific potential of both parties, as emphasized by the Vice-Rector in his speech.



Al-Farabi Kazakh National University has established close ties with institutions and universities in the United Kingdom in the fields of science, higher education, and cultural exchange. In particular, the university has signed 11 agreements with universities in the UK, including Lancaster University, London School of Business and Finance, University of Central Lancashire, University of Birmingham, Edinburgh Business School, Middlesex University, Oxford University, and others. Over the past three years, more than 200 graduate students and 25 professors from the university have visited the UK to conduct research as part of an outbound mobility program.

An international scientific and practical conference on the topic "Development of constitutional and legal science of Kazakhstan: history, problems, prospects" was held in the Farabi Library.

Leading scientists, representatives of government agencies of the Republic of Kazakhstan, civil society, teachers, doctoral students, undergraduates, students and media representatives, attended the meeting.


CHINESE VICE PREMIER LIU GUOZHONG VISITS KAZNU TO OPEN 5G LABORATORY



During his visit, the "5G/5.5G Communication Technologies" laboratory was inaugurated. This new center aims to advance telecommunications technology in Kazakhstan.

The opening ceremony included notable attendees such as Zhang Xiao, Chinese Ambassador to Kazakhstan, Zhanseit Tuimebayev, Rector of KazNU, Guo Wei, Deputy Head of the State Council Office, Li Hui, Special Representative for Eurasian Affairs, Zhang Xingwang, Deputy Minister of Agriculture, Li Fei, Deputy Minister of Commerce, along with university scientists, faculty, and students.





The laboratory is set to train specialists in telecommunication systems, enhance Internet speed, and work on the 6G network. It will also facilitate the production and assembly of high-tech communication devices.

The laboratory is the first Chinese branch in Kazakhstan, reflecting the strong partnership between the two countries. "I believe that the new scientific laboratory will foster further development and cooperation between our universities," stated Rector Tuimebayev.

Sponsored by Huawei, the laboratory was established jointly by KazNU and Northwest Polytechnic University (NWPU).



During his visit, Liu Guozhong also explored the Kazakh-Chinese joint laboratory "Remote Sensing and Application Technology," the Research Center of Medicinal Plants, and the NWPU branch at KazNU, engaging with scientists and observing ongoing research.



LAUNCHING 3RD EDITION OF «THE CLIMATE CAN'T WAIT» PROJECT IN KAZNU WITH A FRENCH ASSOCIATION

May 17, 2024

The French association XCSS – CROSS COUNTRY SKIING SAND, in collaboration with Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, held unique sporting events from May 17 to 21, 2024.

The association's goal is to encourage as many people as possible worldwide to treat natural resources, especially water, with care. The association was established in 2020. Despite its recent formation, it has already conducted two events in the Moroccan desert, established connections with experts in agronomic research, helped organize the distribution of seeds for cultivation in arid zones, and held workshops for villagers in remote oases on cultivating essential plants, nutrition education, and culinary and craft courses for women. Additionally, they have collaborated on methods to restore atmospheric water to provide villagers with access to drinking water.





The project that the French association XCSS brought to Kazakhstan is called «The climate can't wait». Through this initiative, volunteers from France hope to draw attention to pressing climate change issues. To achieve this, they invented a unique method of skiing on sand. They developed and patented an original model of wooden skis that can be attached to any footwear. Although the ambassador of the XCSS team is Olympic figure skating champion Mr. Gwendal Peizerat, sand skiing is accessible to people of all ages and requires no special training. The director of the association, Ms. Estelle Peyen, and her colleagues aim to use their sand skiing events to attract as many partners and interested specialists as possible to jointly seek solutions to climate change issues. They advocate for engaging in sports and tourism that do not harm the environment but instead help preserve the natural and cultural heritage of peoples, including the rich traditions of residents in remote villages. The XCSS association is recognized by the UN Climate Change Secretariat and contributes to the organization's Decade on Ecosystem Restoration.

In Almaty, the association, in collaboration with Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, launched the third edition of their project «The climate can't wait», which coincided with the university's 90th anniversary and the 10th anniversary of its status as a global hub of the UN Academic Impact program. Under the aegis of the Faculty of Geography and Environmental Management at KazNU, and with the support of the Ban Ki-Moon Institute for Sustainable Development, conferences were held on topics such as ecology, sports, ecotourism, environmental protection, careful conservation of water resources, human health, and proper nutrition. There were also discussions on the impact of modern urban lifestyles on the atmosphere and the harm of CO2 emissions on public health. The project placed significant emphasis on the culture and traditions of Kazakhstan. The crafts center "Qazar-Oner" showcased its products and conducted workshops, focusing on the creations of kazakh craftswomen.

The eco-tour to the famous singing dunes in the Altyn-Emel National Park was attended by a number of prominent guests, including the Consul General of France in Almaty, Mr. Fabrice Neveu, the Ambassador of the Assembly of People of Kazakhstan to France, Ms. Malgorzata Thouard, an environmental expert from the Public Chamber of the Mazhilis of Parliament, Ms. Aizhan Skakova, and a team from KazNU. All participants had the opportunity to try the French innovation of sand skiing, as well as take part in the environmental action "March of the Parks" to support protected natural areas, and an environmental cleanup campaign in Altyn-Emel National Park.

KazNU hopes that sand skiing will inspire people and prompt them to consider whether we live in harmony with nature and properly value the riches it provides



KAZNU AND NANJING UNIVERSITY LAUNCH JOINT LABORATORY ON NANOTECHNOLOGIES

May 20, 2024

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University and Nanjing University of Science and Technology (NUST) signed several cooperation agreements, culminating in the grand opening of the International Kazakh-Chinese Scientific Laboratory on Energy-Efficient Nanotechnologies.

Prof. Yerkin Duissenov, Vice-Rector for Operations at KazNU, welcomed the Chinese delegation led by NUST Rector Fu Menyin. Prof. Duissenov highlighted NUST's 70th anniversary celebrated in September of the previous year.





Faculty members from both universities have actively participated in conferences and exchanged visits, emphasizing the joint laboratory's goal to conduct fundamental and applied research in Kazakhstan, China, and beyond.

The meeting included discussions on mutual cooperation, focusing on the joint laboratory's activities and the dual-diploma master's program. The signed agreements aim to foster effective research and educational collaboration between the two institutions.



KAZNU AND FRENCH INSTITUTE ESTABLISH ARCHAEOZOOLOGICAL RESEARCH CENTER

May 20, 2024

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University and the Institute of Ecology and Environment of France signed an agreement to establish the "Archaeozoological Center for the Study of Central Asia." This was finalized during a visit by the French delegation to KazNU.

KazNU's Vice-Rector for Operations, Prof. Yerkin Duyssenov, and the Institute's Director, Stéphane Blanc, discussed the center's opening, its material and technical setup, and its main research areas. Prof. Duyssenov highlighted the growing cooperation between KazNU and French universities, noting that the new center will further expand these partnerships.

"The Kazakh National University collaborates with 21 higher education institutions and organizations in France. Our Kazakh-French scientific and educational center 'Geoenergetics' is active, with many students participating in academic mobility programs, internships, and summer schools. The new center will address regional natural issues and increase research projects," said Prof. Duyssenov.



Stéphane Blanc expressed gratitude for the hospitality and enthusiasm for the collaboration. "The international laboratory aims to study human societies' past through the dynamics of human-animal relations (archaeology). Research will include laboratory analyses and international field missions across Central Asia," he stated.

The meeting concluded with an agreement to systematically implement the plans for the new joint laboratory.



KAZNU SHOWCASES AT KAZAKH HIGHER EDUCATION EXHIBITION IN SINGAPORE

May 23, 2024

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University participated in an exhibition on Kazakh higher education and the Bolashak program in Singapore.



Held during the Kazakh-Singapore Rectors' Forum "New Frontiers of Partnership in Science and Higher Education," the exhibition featured leading Kazakh universities, including L. Gumilev Eurasian National University, Kazakh National Agrarian Research University, K. Satpayev Kazakh National Technical University, D. Serikbayev East-Kazakhstan Technical University, and Semipalatinsk State University named after Shakarim, along with JSC "Center for International Programs."

The event aimed to inform Singapore residents about Kazakh universities, explain the Bolashak program, and foster collaboration between Kazakh and Singaporean institutions, paving the way for joint projects.



KazNU Rector Zhanseit Tuimebayev highlighted the university's educational activities and scientific projects, inviting Singaporean researchers to collaborate on joint initiatives. KAZNU OPENS FARABI CHEM SCIENCE CLUSTER

June 1, 2024

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University has inaugurated the Farabi Chem Science cluster at its Faculty of Chemistry and Chemical Technologies. The facility comprises nine state-of-the-art laboratories.

The cluster aims to identify and analyze environmental pollutants, develop new materials for chemical current sources, conduct in-depth petrochemical research, and devise methods for creating domestic biomedical agents and antibacterial coatings.



The opening ceremony featured notable attendees, including Minister of Science and Higher Education Sayasat Nurbek, Harvard University Professor Mark Elliot, and KazNU Rector Zhanseit Tuimebayev. Dean Alina Galeeva detailed the laboratories' functions and research directions.

Minister Nurbek emphasized President Kasym-Jomart Tokayev's focus on advancing domestic science and education, highlighting the importance of innovative approaches. "We must increase our scientific potential to become a leading nation," he stated.



Rector Tuimebaev noted the laboratories' potential to address critical issues in medicine and biology. These facilities will enable the creation of refractory coatings, study new inorganic materials, and provide quantitative and qualitative substance analysis. Equipped with the latest technology, the laboratories foster a conducive environment for scientific research.

The cluster includes laboratories for analytical chemistry and environment, electrochemical production technologies, petrochemistry, chemical-medical research, fine organic synthesis, energy-intensive nanomaterials, advanced materials and technologies, high-precision diagnostics, and Chemical Coatings Innovations. The cost of the new equipment is 1 billion tenge.



INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE "MODEL UN – NEW SILK ROAD" 2024 June 8. 2024

The international youth conference "Model UN – New Silk Road" 2024 began at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, dedicated to the role of youth in achieving the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) was held. The conference focused on climate action, gender equality, and the attainment of all 17 SDGs, and also marks the 90th anniversary of the university and the 10th anniversary of its status as a Global Hub of the United Nations Academic Impact program.



The event was opened by Prof. Yerkin Duyssenov, Chairperson of the Sustainable Development Committee, Member of the Board – Vice-Rector for Operational Activities of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University. In his speech, he emphasized the increasing role of youth as a key element of human capital and the new demands placed on universities. A Kazakh-American joint center for cytomatrix studies will be established at the Faculty of Biology and Biotechnology at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University.



University of Houston professor and PhD Shaiken Tattim visited KazNU and met with Vice-Rector for Operations Prof. Yerkin Duyssenov. During the meeting, they signed a memorandum to establish the center.

This agreement aims to enhance partnerships in studying cytomatrix properties and characteristics, contributing to cell biology advancements and innovative anti-cancer therapies in Kazakhstan.

Vice-Rector Duyssenov highlighted the importance of the memorandum, stating that KazNU is always ready for scientific collaboration. Prof. Tattim outlined the center's primary tasks, emphasizing its role in cancer diagnostics and expanding pharmacogenetic and molecular testing capabilities. "This will increase our opportunities to treat and prevent deadly cancers," he noted.

The meeting concluded with an agreement to proceed with the center's establishment.



STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIP IN DEVELOPING ECO TOURISM

June 19, 2024

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University and Vatel School of Hospitality and Tourism (France) have formed a strategic partnership to enhance hospitality and tourism education. This collaboration allows students to earn dual degrees, combining KazNU's academic training with Vatel's international standards.



A French delegation, including Fabrice Neveu (French Consul General in Almaty), Aline Renard Wang (Director of International Development for Vatel), and Alex Bortolan (Cultural Cooperation Advisor at the French Embassy in Kazakhstan), met with KazNU leadership. Vice-Rector Prof. Yerkin Duyssenov highlighted KazNU's rise from 230th to 163rd in the QS World University Rankings and its collaborations with French universities.

Aline Renard Wang praised the partnership, noting that Vatel, ranked 11th in hospitality management by QS, aims to prepare students for the global hospitality industry. The dual-degree program will enhance students' competitiveness in the job market.

"At Vatel, we believe in learning hospitality through diverse cultural experiences. Our students can study and intern at any of our 55 campuses in 31 countries," said Wang. Graduates are in high demand globally, with opportunities in top hotels across 32 countries.

The meeting concluded with the signing of a cooperation agreement, including plans to open a Vatel branch at KazNU.



KAZNU RESEARCHERS CONDUCTED FIELD RESEARCH IN THE SOUTHERN REGION OF THE COUNTRY

July 1, 2024

Within the framework of implementation of research work under the program "Scientific and applied justification of management of natural-agricultural systems (NAG) to prevent desertification processes in the southern regions of Kazakhstan, to ensure sustainable development of rural areas", researchers of Al-Farabi KazNU conducted field studies of the state of natural-agricultural systems of agricultural and pasture use.





Participants of the field expedition: faculty members of the Department of Geography, Land Management and Cadastre, Cartography and Geoinformatics, Biodiversity and Bioresources, as well as staff of the Center for Space Technologies and Remote Sensing of the Earth (Earth Remote Sensing Center).

SDG 13, focused on combating climate change and SDG 15, aimed at preserving terrestrial ecosystems, were included in the program for monitoring the development of desertification processes at key sites.

The main objectives of the expedition included study of the current state of ASB of agricultural and pasture use, identification of the main factors contributing to desertification processes, as well as development of scientifically applied recommendations on sustainable management of the territories.

A total of 96 observation reference points were surveyed, covering natural and anthropogenic SAR complexes of agricultural and pasture use.

All planned locations were surveyed during the fieldwork period. At all survey points, soil pits were described, soil samples were collected, the natural-territorial complex (NTC) was sampled using a drone, and vegetation cover was collected. Natural and artificial (quarries) outcrops were studied and described at some observation points.

Field analysis of the leading physiographic and geomorphologic processes was carried out at the observation sites for comparison with remote sensing data. Preliminary field data were partially processed, and a database was created for further desk study. During the field stage, soil samples, video and photo materials were collected from the reference points.



DELEGATION OF KAZNU VISITED URUMQI WITH A WORKING VISIT

July 2, 2024

Delegation of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University consisting of vice-rectors, heads of departments and professors paid a working visit to Urumqi city of China.

As part of the business trip, they took part in the Silk Road Health Forum, the Fifth "One Belt, One Road" Academic Summit and the Fifth Shanghai Cooperation Organization Hospital Cooperation

Forum.

The event was organized by the Health Commission of Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region, the China Hospital Association, and the People's Hospital of Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region.



During the working trip to China a number of agreements were reached. In particular, a joint clinical simulation center with the second state hospital of Xinjiang will be opened on the basis of the Faculty of Medicine and Public Health of KazNU. Within the framework of the memorandum, the second state hospital of Xinjiang will provide the necessary devices and apparatuses. This center, in turn, will contribute to improving the knowledge of teachers and students, training qualified specialists.



A contract was also signed with the Research Center of Medicinal Plants of KazNU and the Chinese Center of Medicinal Plant Products. Under the agreement, specialists from the two centers will exchange experience and jointly conduct scientific research.



AL-FARABI KAZNU TOWARDS TO BUILDING RESILIENT INFRASTRUCTURE PROMOTE INCLUSIVE AND SUSTAINABLE INDUSTRIALIZATION, AND FOSTERING INNOVATION

July 3, 2024

At the meeting of the Head of State of Kazakhstan Kassym Zhomart Tokayev and Chairman of the People's Republic of China Xi Jinping signed an agreement on the delivery of a supercomputer to Al-Farabi KazNU.

The supercomputer will be used to create digital twins, artificial intelligence technology, knowledge-intensive computing in the main areas of the university's activities, management and organization of IoT-objects, development of software for the management of Smart-technology objects and many others.

It should be noted that the peak performance of the proposed supercomputer is 1.94 PFLOPS and will be the most powerful supercomputer in Central Asia.

The supercomputer will create an opportunity for scientists throughout Kazakhstan to work with large amounts of data, model various situations of government agencies, and become a new era in the development of the country's IT infrastructure.



KAZNU AND NWPU WILL LAUNCH A MICROSATELLITE INTO SPACE

July 3, 2024

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University and Northwest Polytechnic University of the People's Republic of China signed an agreement on microsatellite scientific research.

This agreement was reached during negotiations between the Head of State Kasym-Jomart Tokayev and President of the People's Republic of China Xi Jinping, who arrived on an official visit to Kazakhstan.











This initiative is being implemented for the first time among Kazakhstani universities at Al-Farabi KazNU.

Joint work, in turn, opens the way to space research, training of qualified specialists and development of common satellites. It also makes it possible to conduct remote sensing studies of the Earth using a microsatellite.

Northwestern Polytechnic University is a leader in space launches in the PRC.





The aim of the project is to develop equipment for gravimetric measurements, including a special ground station and a transmitter on board the satellite to detect density inhomogeneities in the Earth's crust and mantle. This payload is intended to solve fundamental problems in the study of geodynamic processes at great depths.

The microsatellite, realized jointly by the two universities, is planned to be launched into space within the framework of the SCO Year of Ecology and the 90th anniversary of KazNU.

It should be noted that the Kazakh National University named after Al-Farabi is the only university in our country that has experience in launching nanosatellites into Earth orbit. To date, the institution of higher education has launched nanosatellites "Al-Farabi-1" and "Al-Farabi-2".



SCIENTIFIC AND EDUCATIONAL TIES BETWEEN UNIVERSITIES OF THE SCO MEMBER STATES WILL INCREASE

July 4, 2024

The International Symposium of SCO Universities "Cooperation in Higher Education and Production Integration" was held in Astana.

The large-scale event was attended by Bolat Akchulakov, Advisor to the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan, Huai Jinpeng, Minister of Education of the People's Republic of China, Sayasat Nurbek, Minister of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Kazakhstan, Secretariat of the Silk Road Universities Alliance, Zhanseit Tuimebayev, Chairman of the Board - Rector of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, Liqun Zhang, Rector of Xi'an Jiaotong University, Serik Omirbaev, Acting Rector of Astana IT University, and rectors of 30 universities.



The international meeting is organized by the Silk Road Universities Alliance, Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, Xi'an Jiaotong University and Astana IT University.

The symposium was opened by Bolat Akchulakov, Advisor to the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan. In turn, Minister of Science and Higher Education Sayasat Nurbek noted that in recent years, the partnership between universities of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization has reached a new level. During the event, the rector of KazNU Zhanseit Tuimebayev spoke about the activities of higher education institutions as an active participant of the SCO. In his speech, the head of the university also noted the importance of participation of the world's universities in the international event.

An exhibition of educational and scientific achievements of the SCO member countries was also organized during the event.



COOPERATION IN HIGHER EDUCATION BETWEEN THE UNIVERSITIES OF THE SILK ROAD ALLIANCE WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE SCO STATE MEETING

July 4, 2024

At the international symposium, "Cooperation in Higher Education and Production Integration" held in Astana, the Silk Road Universities Alliance (UASR) signed an agreement on China-Kazakhstan cooperation in the spheres of industry, education, science, technology. The initiators of the agreement are Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, Xi'an Jiaotong TBEA Co., Ltd. and Farabi Technology Innovation Park.



The main objective is to promote coordinated development of science, technology, education and human resources by connecting to global innovation resources and integrating into the global innovation ecosystem. Under the agreement, Al-Farabi Kazakh National University will act as a liaison for Kazakh universities and Xi'an Jiaotong University for the Chinese side. The two universities will be responsible for day-to-day communication and coordination, jointly ensuring the effective resolution of specific issues on cooperation and interaction between the universities of both countries.

The document identifies 197 enterprises that are among the Chinese members of the collaboration. These manufacturing companies work closely with Xi'an Jiaotong University, UASR member universities and member universities of the Yellow River Basin University Alliance. Kazakhstani members of the collaboration included Farabi Technology Innovation Park.

To develop the partnership, comprehensive support will be provided to Chinese and Kazakh universities and enterprises to establish overseas innovation centers and consortia. The centers will pool scientific and technological innovation resources to promote regional technological progress. To integrate industry, universities and research, the consortia will implement the "1121" model - "One Center, One Incubator, Two Chains, and One Common Platform". The model will promote cross-border cooperation between industry, universities and research institutes.


According to the organizers, the agreement aims to integrate educational resources with industry needs, achieve mutual benefits and results, and support the further development of the Silk Road Economic Belt.



KAZNU AND XI'AN JIAOTONG UNIVERSITY WILL CREATE A RESEARCH AND INNOVATION CENTER

July 5, 2024

The delegation headed by the President of Xi'an Jiaotong Zhang Liyun visited Kazakh National University named after Al-Farabi and met with the staff of the university. The meeting was attended by vice-rectors, heads of departments and structural units, deans of faculties, scientists, and faculty.





The event was opened by the Chairman of the Board - Rector of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University Zhanseit Tuimebayev, who noted that cooperation between the two universities is developing at a high pace.

"Jiaotong University is the oldest higher education institution in China. Next year, the university will celebrate its 130th anniversary. Currently, the university has more than 59 thousand students. And according to the results of international rankings, we rank first in the world in the field of mechanical engineering. During the meeting Zhanseit Tuimebayev awarded the President of Xi'an Jiaotong University Zhang Liqun the title of "Honorary Professor of KazNU" by the decision of the Academic Council.

After the event, members of the delegation visited scientific laboratories and centers of the university, got acquainted with the scientific infrastructure of KazNU. In addition, they visited the branch of the Northwestern Polytechnic University of China, operating on the basis of the university, and were satisfied with the results of the work.



KAZNU ESTABLISHES COOPERATION WITH KYUNGDONG UNIVERSITY

July 9, 2024

Chairman of the Board - Rector of Al-Farabi KazNU Zhanseit Tuimebayev met with the delegation headed by the President of Kyungdong University Mr. Lee Jong.





At the meeting, Rector of KazNU Zhanseit Tuimebayev spoke about the activities of the university and its achievements, noting that the study of oriental languages within the walls of the university began in the 70s of the twentieth century. "The Faculty of Oriental Studies of the University is a large center of training of highly qualified specialists with knowledge of Oriental languages, in demand abroad and in various spheres of economy and foreign policy of the country. The Far East Department is successfully working at the faculty," the rector said. In his speech, he noted the scientific and educational experience of KazNU with universities, institutes and organizations of Korea.

Leading Korean scientists have been engaged for scientific supervision and lecturing to PhD students of KazNU. In 2022, three professors from Sunmen University of Korea were invited to the university. One of them - Professor Lee Beng Jo today continues teaching activities in the walls of KazNU. The university also has an International Center of Korean Studies, aimed at comprehensive study of Korean history, culture, politics, economics, Korean language.




KAZNU SCIENTISTS HAVE DEVELOPED A WAY TO SAVE HUMAN LIVES

July 15, 2024

Scientists from the Faculty of Chemistry and Chemical Technology at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University have improved surgical thread used during operations and developed an

antibacterial coating.



"Today, medical professionals use surgical threads to stitch wounds during surgery. In some cases, bacteria can appear on the surface of the threads, causing infections. This can lead to a repeat surgery, which can be life-threatening," say the scientists from the "ChemMedLab" laboratory.

"Surgical threads do not have such a protective mechanism as the human body. They are an optimal environment for the adhesion and growth of harmful microorganisms. Our research group aims to create an antibacterial coating on the surface of surgical threads and bring it to production. Multi-layered nanoscale coatings are applied to the surface of the threads, with the final layer containing an antibacterial agent. Unlike conventional antibiotics, this agent acts quickly against bacteria," says Aizhan Seydullaeva, a researcher at the laboratory.

Currently, the university has received a patent for the developed antibacterial surgical threads and published articles in international journals. The innovative project has attracted the interest of RuMa Farm, a company that produces surgical threads used in operations, which has expressed a willingness to collaborate with the researchers.

"Analogues of antibacterial filaments are available on the world market. However, this project is being implemented in our country for the first time. During surgeries, surgeons treat threads with alcohol or a chlorhexidine solution and then stitch the wound. However, this approach has a drawback: it is not very effective in combating infection. The threads we have developed will feature coatings that will prevent bacteria from settling if necessary. Additionally, the antibacterial effect lasts for one month," says Aizhan Seydullaeva.

The scientists at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University are not planning to stop there. In the future, they intend to conduct further research on this project and bring the products to market.



AL-FARABI BUSINESS SCHOOL EXPANDS THE BOUNDARIES OF PARTNERSHIP July 15, 2024

Representatives of Al-Farabi Business School of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University visited universities in Spain and Portugal. The purpose of the business trip is to deepen international cooperation and establish new partnerships with leading educational institutions in

Europe.





The delegation of Al-Farabi Business School visited GBSB-Global Business School and discussed the prospects of mutually beneficial cooperation at the meeting. This business school is internationally recognized and accredited by ACBSP, MFHEA, ASIC and CBA, BSB Global.

Within the framework of the visit the specialists got acquainted with the internship program for undergraduates of KazNU. Meetings with official representatives of the business school allowed to discuss the possibilities of expanding academic and scientific cooperation between educational institutions. Also Al-Farabi Business School and Porto Business School signed a memorandum of understanding. Porto Business School is ranked 108th in QS 2024 Europe Ranking and is known for its international presence and regular participation in the Financial Times ranking since 2011, as well as AMBA award for achievements in entrepreneurship.

During the visit was discussed and created a special internship program for Kazakhstani masters and doctoral students, including both theoretical training and practical interaction with leading companies in Portugal.

The delegation of KazNU Business School also held a meeting at the Autonomous University of Madrid, one of the leading autonomous universities in Spain. As a result of the visit a memorandum of understanding was signed, discussing the prospects of a two-diploma program between universities. Master students of Al-Farabi Business School plan to start a research internship at the Autonomous University of Madrid this fall, which will be a new important stage in their academic training and international experience.

This business trip emphasized Al-Farabi Business School's aspiration to develop international relations and strengthen its position in the world educational arena.

KAZNU CREATED AN ARCHAEOLOGICAL EXPEDITION WITH CAMBRIDGE SCIENTISTS

August 6, 2024

The archaeological expedition "Tarbagatai" of Al-Farabi KazNU conducts field research in the Abay region. The expedition is made up of doctoral, master's and undergraduate students of KazNU, as well as young scientists from Cambridge University.

This project is implemented in the Ushbulak complex within the framework of the scientific grant of the Science Committee of the Ministry of Education and Science of the Republic of Kazakhstan on the theme "Archaeological complexes of the Early Iron Age in the southern slopes of Tarbagatai: interdisciplinary research".





The archaeological complex Ushbulak is located near the village of Taskesken in Urjar district of Abay region. This complex contains ancient settlements, funerary structures and rock paintings.

Excavation work was carried out at one of the dwellings of Ushbulak-1 settlement. As a result, fragments of pottery, osteological material and tools were found. Several stone planes with ancient drawings located near the settlement were also photographed. The planes depict images of different compositions, most of which belong to the Early Iron Age.

The expedition staff organised field trips for schoolchildren in the village of Taskesken and gave short lectures on archaeological science.

The head of the scientific project and expedition is the Head of the Department of Archaeology, Ethnology and Museology, PhD Rinat Zhumataev.



SCIENTIFIC TIES WITH CHINESE SPECIALISTS ARE EXPANDING

August 8, 2024

Chairman of the Board of Kazakhstan-China Trade Association Kanat Beisek and a delegation from the Chinese city of Linyi arrived at Al-Farabi KazNU with a working visit.



The visit took place within the framework of the exhibition of industrial goods and services of Linyi, which is held in Almaty. The large-scale event was initiated by the Kazakhstan-China Trade Promotion Association and the administration of the city of Linyi (Shandong Province, PRC).

A Seismic Centre will be established at Al-Farabi KazNU. The heads of partner universities - KazNU and the University of Tsukuba (Japan) agreed on the implementation of a joint project.

KAZNU UNDERGRADUATES HAVE BEEN TRAINED IN FRANCE


September 11, 2024

September 17, 2024


Global Online course on Sustainable Financing and Impact Investing coordinated by Ban Ki-moon Institute for Sustainable Development is launched for KazNU students.

The MDP is an interdisciplinary graduate degree program, which prepares students to better identify and address the challenges of sustainable development. Program designed for generalist development practitioners, specialist development practitioners, policy administrators and policy professionals, private-sector professionals, educators.

On September 17th, 2024 a practical introductory workshop of the online course on Sustainable Financing and Impact Investing delivered by Prof. Glenn Yago and Prof. Steven Zecher from the Jerusalem Institute for Policy Research's Milken Innovation Center where it gathered over 60 listeners, among them 25 students from KazNU.





SCIENTIFIC COOPERATION WITH THE GERMAN RESEARCH SOCIETY

September 18, 2024



A meeting with representatives of the German Research Society (DFG) was held at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University as part of the expansion of scientific cooperation with the Central Asian region.

The purpose of the visit to the Al-Farabi Kazakh National University is to strengthen bilateral scientific cooperation at the institutional level. On this occasion, the university organized a hybrid information event with the participation of more than 100 stakeholders for all faculties. German colleagues presented their institutes, met with potential partner institutions and demonstrated research developments.



The participants also identified possible thematic areas for future cooperation: They also serve to achieve the UN Sustainable Development Goals and have been mentioned as priority research areas in the EU-Central Asia Strategy (energy security, climate protection, environment, health and digitalization). DFG is already financing research projects in these areas together with Kazakh partners.



WORLD METEOROLOGICAL ORGANIZATION CONDUCTS TRAINING IN THE TREASURY

September 18, 2024

A two-day international training course for meteorologists on satellite meteorological data and its application, the WMO-CIMSS Meteorologist Training on Satellite Meteorological Data, has begun at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University.

The Faculty of Geography and Environmental Management organized this event in collaboration with the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) and the Kazakhstan Meteorological Institute (KMI).



The purpose of the training is to provide comprehensive information on the use of satellite data for meteorological purposes. It will include laboratory classes so that forecasters can gain hands-on experience working with products based on real data.

Representatives of the World Meteorological Organization, young scientists and students of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University and leading universities of Kazakhstan, Azerbaijan, Armenia, Belarus, Kyrgyzstan, the Republic of Moldova, the Russian Federation, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan take part in the training.

The classes were taught by Tim Wagner, a researcher from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in the USA, and Natalia Donohova, head of the Department of Space Systems and Applications at the World Meteorological Organization.



KazNU students carry out forensic examination with the latest equipment

8 November 2024

Students of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University are engaged in conducting forensic examinations. The Centre for Forensic Expertise, established in 2016, is now equipped with the latest equipment.



This centre was opened for the first time among domestic universities in KazNU. It was also one of the first to receive a licence to train specialists performing forensic examination. Here students, masters and doctoral students of higher education institution undergo practical training to improve their knowledge. The centre has a full opportunity to conduct special studies in such areas as: examination of documents, trace, ballistic, computer, molecular-genetic expertise.

Here students are taught by teachers of KazNU, who have passed training and advanced training under the programme 'Bolashak' in Great Britain and Turkey. According to scientists of the Department of Criminal Law, Criminal Procedure and Criminalistics of the Faculty of Law, the centre provides methodological and methodological assistance to law enforcement agencies.

'We have a comparative microscope for forensic examination, including ballistic examination. Its main peculiarity is that it is designed to study offences committed with the help of small arms. That is, it helps to determine the trajectory of a bullet and from what direction it was fired. With the help of a comparative microscope it is possible to find out whether a person committed suicide or someone killed him. Only Al-Farabi KazNU has such a device among domestic universities,' said Sulushash Daubasova, a senior lecturer at KazNU.

The centre also has a box for detecting offenders by smell and a machine for analysing small arms. Specialists of the Forensic Centre intend to conduct joint research and training of specialists in IT, chemistry, physics and biology in the future together with KazNU faculties.

Prospects of science and artificial intelligence

12 December 2024

The Farabi Library hosted the Artificial Intelligence Farabi Fest (AI Farabi Fest), organized by the Department of Artificial Intelligence and Big Data of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University with the support of NVIDIA Corporation and leading experts in the field of artificial intelligence.

The event has become a unique platform for exploring advanced technologies and their real-world applications in areas such as medicine, computer, games, education and creativity.

AI Farabi Fest is aimed at popularizing artificial intelligence technologies, demonstrating their capabilities and practical applications. This is a source of inspiration for the participants, an incentive to use AI to solve real problems.

The event was attended by experts from NVIDIA and other industry leaders, scientists and teachers studying at the university.





Oleg Shkoda, senior technical product marketing manager at NVIDIA Corporation, introduced GeForce RTX technologies, which are actively changing the approach to learning, gaming and creativity, providing a new level of performance thanks to innovations in graphics, artificial intelligence and hardware acceleration.

Alexander Erokhin, managing director of HYPERPC Kazakhstan, spoke about the future of gaming technologies and artificial intelligence. The interaction of innovations in graphics, computing power and AI allows not only to create new types of content, but also changes the way users perceive technology. Nurzhan Baltabai, technical director of 3MIS LLP, focused on digital medical systems aimed at improving the diagnosis, treatment and monitoring of patient health.

After the speeches, the speakers answered numerous questions from the students. Students were given fitcoins for the best questions.

Various interactive AI contests were also held, which allowed students to test their skills in AI-related tasks: from image recognition and audio to solving chess problems generated by neural networks.

For active participation in sessions with speakers, in the AI CTF tournament, as well as in AI contests, students received bitcoins for which they could take prizes in the prize shop. Among the popular prizes were hoodies, backpacks, thermal mugs and branded stickers of the festival.

AI Farabi Fest 2024 has become an important step in promoting AI technologies in Kazakhstan. The organizers express their gratitude to all participants and sponsors and are preparing for new large-scale events in the future.

The archaeozoological centre ZooStan is now open

8 November 2024

The first scientific Kazakh-French centre 'Archaeozoological Centre for the Study of Central Asia - ZooStan' was opened in Al-Farabi KazNU. On the part of France, the organiser was CNRS - the leading state scientific institution of France.



The main objective of the ZooStan Centre is to study the past of human societies through the prism of the dynamics of human-animal relations over the last million years.

Three main themes are being studied within the work of the research centre: 'Evolution of paleofauna and archaeological sites', 'Animals as a driving force behind the evolution of technological,

economic and symbolic activities of human society', and 'Human settlement in extreme environments, especially at high altitudes'.

The research centre consists of 13 researchers from France, Kazakhstan, USA, Pakistan, Tajikistan and Kyrgyzstan. The director of ZooStan is William Rendue and the co-director from Kazakhstan is Rinat Zhumataev.

The Centre's activities are carried out in three areas: archaeological excavations, laboratory research and training of the young generation in the latest methods of archaeological research.

Field research is conducted at 13 archaeological sites located in France, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan. New monuments have been discovered during the field work.

Two scientific platforms - Cementochronology and ZooMS - are also being created on the basis of the Archaeozoological Centre. The method of cementochronology is aimed at studying the seasonality of birth, death and age of mammals. Its wide application will make it possible to answer many intriguing questions in the archaeology of Central Asia, such as: the season of habitation of different archaeological sites, the season of construction of burial mounds, the life expectancy of animals and people at different times in different territories.

The ZooMS laboratory will carry out proteomic analysis aimed at identifying animal bones. The fact is that most of the bones found by archaeologists are tiny fragments that cannot be identified. Of course, the application of the latest method is extremely important for modern archaeology.

In such a short period of time the scientific centre has achieved significant results. Scientists have published two articles and are preparing to print three articles in Web of Science Q1 journals. Two major international expeditions were held in Tajikistan and France. Financing of two large European projects totalling 650 thousand euros was attracted. Laboratory staff member S.V.Schneider organised a session on Central Asia at the World Neolithic Congress in Turkey in November 2024.

Preparatory work is currently underway for the organisation of an international archaeological school in France, scheduled for June 2025.

Laboratory of applied microbiology opened in KazNU

21 November 2024

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University hosted the international conference "Sustainable Future-2024: Biotech, Ecology, Energy" dedicated to the 90th anniversary of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University. Within the framework of the event, the International Laboratory of Applied Microbiology, created on the basis of Kazakh-German-Chinese partnership, was opened.





The event was attended by representatives of management, scientists, professors, teachers and students of universities. Scientists from leading universities of Germany, China, Pakistan and Kazakhstan made presentations. More than 60 students and young scientists from different countries of Central Asia presented reports and booklets on their research work.

The plenary session was opened by member of the Board - Vice-Rector for Scientific and Innovative Activities Zhamila Aitzhanova. She noted that Al-Farabi KazNU, Research Institute of Ecology and Bioresource Sustainability, faculties of Biology and Biotechnology, Geography and Nature Management make a significant contribution to sustainable development through education, research, partnership and social initiatives.

"Educational programs of KazNU faculties are aimed at training specialists who understand the importance of obtaining environmentally friendly products, processing raw materials necessary for agriculture and ecology. Thanks to scientific research, field experiments, cooperation with international

organizations, our students and teachers form the future of the industry focused on environmental sustainability and bio-resources", - emphasized the Vice-Rector in her speech.

At the plenary session, presentations were made by: Professor Ilya Diegel-Aachensky (University of Applied Sciences, Germany), Professor Nurshat Nurazhi (Renewable Energy Laboratory, Department of Chemistry and Materials Science, School of Engineering and Digital Sciences, Nazarbayev University (Astana), Professor Dr. Zulfihar Ali-IOFS, Director of Pakistan Division of Programs and Projects (Pakistan) and others.

The conference focused on cutting-edge advances in food and agricultural biotechnology, biodiversity conservation strategies and innovative biotechnological approaches to coal waste treatment. The conference resulted in the publication of 40 articles, recognized as the best, in journals indexed in the scientific database Scopus.

The opening ceremony of the International Laboratory of Applied Microbiology on the basis of Kazakhstan-German-Chinese partnership was held within the framework of the conference. The event was attended by German, Chinese and domestic scientists. Prof. Ilya Digel-Aachensky (University of Applied Sciences, Germany) was awarded the medal "Eren eenbegi ushin". The participants were also awarded cash prizes in the nominations "Best Poster" and "Best Report".

The laboratory's activity is aimed at the development of scientific research in the field of biotechnology at the international level, introduction of innovative biotechnologies and increasing the scientific potential of Kazakhstan. The scientific center was created as a result of joint work of Kazakh, German and Chinese scientists, focusing on applied branches of microbiology - agriculture, ecology, medicine and industry. The project will be a great contribution of Kazakhstan to the competitiveness of science and the realization of the Sustainable Development Goals.

Prospects for the development of quantum technologies

19 December 2024

Employees of the department of computer science, faculty of information technologies, Kazakh National University named after Al-Farabi visited SPINQ, a company based in Shenzhen (China), which specializes in the development of compact quantum computers.

The research group consisted of head of the department of computer science, Daribayev Beimbet Serikovich, doctoral student Mukhanbet Aksultan Aituaruly, and master's student Azatbekuly Nurtugan. During the visit, they got acquainted with compact models of quantum computers, such as SPINQ Gemini, SPINQ Gemini Lab, and SPINQ Triangulum. These devices are unique quantum systems designed for educational and research purposes, as well as for solving practical problems in scientific and industrial environments. SPINQ representatives demonstrated how quantum technologies can be used to solve optimization tasks and simulate complex physical processes that are beyond the reach of traditional computing systems.

The visit was an important step in expanding scientific collaboration and deepening knowledge in the field of quantum technologies. Currently, negotiations are underway between the two organizations to sign a cooperation agreement, which will further develop joint projects in the field of quantum technologies.

At the moment, negotiations are underway to conclude a cooperation agreement that will ensure the further development of joint projects in the field of quantum technologies.





As part of this cooperation, it is planned to purchase a compact quantum computer for the computer science laboratory of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University. A computer uses the laws of quantum mechanics to process data, solving problems differently than traditional systems. This device is a simplified version of a quantum computer, designed mainly for scientific research and educational purposes. Unlike large quantum systems, this computer uses a small number of qubits and can function at room temperature, which makes it a convenient tool for studying the basics of quantum technologies and modeling small quantum processes.

The acquisition of such a device will allow the university to reach a new level in the education and research of quantum systems, as well as prepare specialists to work with advanced technologies of the future.

The university extends its sincere gratitude to SPINQ for the invaluable opportunity to engage with cutting-edge developments and observe the future of computer science in practice.

QS Pre-Summit brings together rectors of the world's universities

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University hosted the QS Higher Education: Asia Pacific 2024 presummit dedicated to higher education. The international event was organised in honour of the 20th anniversary of the QS Asia Pacific Summit.



The meeting was attended by Jason Newman, Chief Commercial Officer of QS Quacquarelli Symonds, Advisor to the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan Malik Otarbayev, Minister of Science and Higher Education Sayasat Nurbek, Chairman of the Board - Rector of KazNU Zhanseit Tuimebayev, Akim of Almaty Yerbolat Dosaev, Regional Director for Client Partnerships in EAEU and Global Government of QS Sergey Khristolyubov. This is 10 thousand more than in the last two years. There are three prestigious rankings in the world. The most important of them is the international QS rating. 21 universities of Kazakhstan participate in the rating. Al-Farabi KazNU is the leader among domestic universities and occupies 163rd place. This year for the first time the Ministry has prepared a rating of domestic national universities. It was compiled jointly with experts of world ratings. Higher education institutions that have shown good results in the national rating will rise in the global QS rating. Such rating is implemented in the country for the first time,' Sayasat Nurbek said.

The plenary session continued in sections devoted to the themes: 'Integrating Global Goals into Education', "Global Connections", "Navigation Technologies: Best Practices in Artificial Intelligence and New Technologies".

At the end of the event Sergey Khristolyubov made a speech, who awarded a number of Kazakh universities, which took high places in the QS World University Rankings 2025, and presented special certificates.

It should be noted that the QS Summit on Higher Education in Asia-Pacific will continue on 5-7 November in Macau. The final meeting of the QS Pre-Summit is scheduled for 8 November in Hong Kong.

At the event, the international rating agency QS presented Al-Farabi Kazakh National University with a Five Star Award in five QS Stars categories.



I believe it is necessary to implement a double-diploma educational programme between the schools in the future. I think both sides will be interested in this. I also propose to open a branch of KazNU in the Swiss School of Applied Sciences in the field of economics and management', - said the rector.

In turn, the rector of the Swiss School of Applied Sciences in Economics and Management Dominique Jordan thanked the leadership of the university for the attention and hospitality. In his speech, the guest of honour supported the proposals of the head of KazNU and stressed that he was ready to make every effort to further strengthen the partnership.

At the end of the meeting, the parties agreed to systematically carry out the above-mentioned works and agreed to establish a joint working group.

Liaison with the University of Pennsylvania

26 November 2024



A delegation from Pennsylvania State University visited Al-Farabi Kazakh National University. The delegation included a specialist in engineering and mechanics, Professor Slava V.

A seminar on the GreenTech Horizons project has begun

A two-day seminar on the GreenTech Horizons project has begun at al-Farabi Kazakh National University, aimed at facilitating the transition to green and digital technologies through education and innovation in the countries of the Eastern Partnership, Central Asia and the Far East.

Welcoming the participants of the meeting, Deputy Chairman of the Board – Acting First Vice-Rector of Al–Farabi Kazakh National University Yerkin Duissenov noted that the Erasmus+ program is the most important strategic tool for improving the quality of education and scientific research. "In recent years, KazNU has been actively participating in this program, which resulted in 86 concluded contracts under the Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility (ICM) program. These agreements open up unique opportunities for our students and teachers to share experience, knowledge and culture with leading universities and research centers around the world", - the Vice-rector said in his speech. 13 projects within the framework of the Erasmus+ program are of particular importance for the university Capacity Building, two of which are implemented as grandholders. These projects play an important role in strengthening academic ties, developing educational and scientific infrastructure.

The project coordinator, professor Daniela Ciric Lalic, UNS, Coordinator of the National Office of





After the official part of the event, professor Daniela Ciric Lalic presented a detailed presentation on the importance of the dual green and digital transitions and cooperation between Europe and Central Asia. She said: "The main goal of the project is the development and implementation of competencies that contribute to sustainable economic growth, job creation, and ensuring the competitiveness of the modern workforce". Within the framework of the project, a competency-based curriculum model will be implemented, which will be used to modernize the curricula of eight universities in Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, and Mongolia. An important aspect of the project is the creation of an e-learning ecosystem, including massive open online courses.



In their presentations on the role and contribution of each partner and the structural management, professors Daniela Grakanin and Milena Savkovic from UNS highlighted that the GreenTech Horizons project involves a multilateral interregional partnership with the participation of educational and industry partners. As the speakers emphasized, the project will create a sustainable platform for integrating innovative technologies into educational processes and will contribute to socio-economic development by enhancing qualifications and expanding opportunities for youth and professionals in the target countries.

Prospects for cooperation with Malikussaleh University

29 November 2024

At the meeting of the delegation of Malikussaleh University (Indonesia) with the leadership of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, the main directions of mutually beneficial partnership were identified.



The honorary guests were welcomed by the Deputy Chairman of the Board – Acting First Vice-Rector of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, Yerkin Duysenov. He spoke about the achievements of the leading university in the country.

According to the First Vice-Rector, the potential for bilateral economic and trade cooperation between Kazakhstan and Indonesia is growing, which opens up new opportunities for academic and scientific exchanges. To date, KazNU has established direct partnerships with four universities in Indonesia: the University of Indonesia, Yogyakarta State University, Sultan Syarif Kasim II State Islamic University, and Darussalam University of Gontor.

The cooperation covers a wide range of areas: student and faculty exchange, implementation of joint research projects, invitation of professors, and supervision of PhD students.

In the 2023/24 academic year, five faculty members from KazNU were sent to educational institutions in Indonesia. Currently, 10 students from Indonesia are studying at KazNU under the scholarship program of the Republic of Kazakhstan. "The potential for cooperation with universities in

Indonesia is very high, and we are ready to expand our partnership and implement exciting joint projects and initiatives", - emphasized Yerkin Ermanovich.

In turn, Professor and Rector of Malikussaleh University (UNIMAL), Herman Fitra, expressed gratitude for the warm visit and provided information about the university's activities – a state non-profit educational institution. UNIMAL is located in the city of Reuleuet. The university was established in 1969, making it one of the youngest in the country. According to the rector, the universities of both countries have great prospects for joint work, project implementation, academic exchange, and other initiatives.

The parties discussed issues related to the development of partnerships, new areas, and prospects for cooperation.

KazNU and NetSCI to establish a new institute

6 December 2024

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University and the German scientific and educational institution NetSCI will open an Institute for the protection and conservation of diodiversity in Central Asia.



Chairman of the Board – Rector of KazNU Zhanseit Tuimebayev and CEO of the German scientific and educational institution NetSCI Matthias Kramer signed a memorandum on the establishment of the center.

The aim of the Institute will be to promote the conservation and enhancement of biological diversity. According to the agreement, the parties will jointly implement scientific projects and attract investments in the field of environmental protection and biodiversity.

During the meeting, Matthias Kramer emphasized that the establishment of this center would serve as a foundation for developing bilateral relations.

"NetSCI GmbH was founded in 2005 and specializes in environmental technologies, knowledge transfer, and supporting innovative projects. The company actively collaborates with universities, research institutions, and enterprises. To date, we have implemented numerous projects with Central Asian countries and have substantial experience in this field. The German Ministry has supported my initiative to establish the institute. We plan to open the center in May 2025 and, to mark the occasion, bring together scientists from Kazakhstan and Germany at a joint conference," - said Matthias Kramer, General Director of the German scientific and educational institution NetSCI.

In turn, the rector of KazNU supported the initiatives of the guest of honor and noted that the higher education institution is ready to open the institute. Zhanseit Tuimebayev also stressed that the signed agreement on the establishment of a joint institute will give a powerful impetus to the development of cooperation not only between educational institutions, but also between countries as a whole.

At the end of the meeting, the head of the university presented Matthias Kramer with the "Al-Farabi" gold medal.



The success of our students not only testifies to the high level of their knowledge and leadership qualities, but also to the university's commitment to support and develop an active youth policy aimed at strengthening co-operation between the countries of the Turkic world.

Winning this competition also supports SDG 4 - 'Quality Education' and SDG 17 - 'Partnership for Sustainable Development', which emphasise the importance of education and international cooperation in achieving a sustainable future.

KazNU scientists received a reward

15 November 2024

Scientists of KazNU were rewarded for publication activity in rating journals of the international database Scopus/Web of Science.



Financial support for researchers publishing at this level allows them to continue their research, improve laboratory conditions, purchase necessary equipment and attract a wider range of specialists. Awarding the best articles also stimulates the academic community to continuous improvement and search for new scientific solutions. This, in turn, attracts young scientists and doctoral students who see that their work can not only be recognized, but also rewarded financially. This measure contributes to strengthening international cooperation, as publications in highly rated journals often open up opportunities for participation in global projects.

In 2023 scientists of KazNU published 1,192 scientific articles. From the total number of published scientific papers 396 authors of publications were rewarded. The works were included in the first and second quartile (Q1 and Q2) according to the international classification of scientific journals. The total amount of awards amounted to 130,205,764 tenge. This choice is due to the fact that articles in Q1-Q2 journals have a high citation rate and more significant impact on the development of science. This measure allows to strengthen the prestige of the university, increasing the chances of taking higher positions in world rankings, such as QS and THE, where publication activity and quality of research are important evaluation criteria. Thus, such rewards play a significant role not only for specific scientists, but also for the development of science in general, stimulating the creation of new knowledge and maintaining a high standard of academic contribution.

Winning the JurAsia InterTax 2024 competition

KazNU scientist awarded prestigious prize

Associate Professor of the Faculty of Physics and Technology at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, Candidate of Physical and Mathematical Sciences, Merlan Klyshuly Dosbolayev, has been awarded the prestigious Asia-Pacific Physical Society Prize (AAPPS-DPP Prize 2024) for his scientific work titled "Studies of the formation and distribution of cracks and various defects on the surface of candidate materials of thermonuclear reactors during the influence of a pulsed plasma flux" The award was announced following the International Conference on Plasma Physics, held in Malacca, Malaysia, from November 3 to 8, 2024.

Professor Dosbolayev's work, dedicated to studying the challenges of plasma interaction with in-vessel materials of thermonuclear reactors, has been recognized as a significant and important contribution to the field of plasma physics and plasma technologies.

The International Conference on Plasma Physics of the Asia-Pacific Physical Society (AAPPS-DPP) is a major scientific forum for the plasma physics community, bringing together more than 500 leading scientists from the Asia-Pacific region, the United States, and Europe.

Merlan K. Dosbolayev is a laureate of the State Prize of the Republic of Kazakhstan in the field of science and technology, a recipient of the "Best University Lecturer" grant, and a three-time recipient of the state scientific scholarship for young and talented scientists. In 2016, he was awarded the prestigious Thomson Reuters "Leader of Science" prize.

His research interests include scientific and technological challenges of controlled thermonuclear fusion, methods of producing and diagnosing low-temperature plasma, experimental studies of plasma-dust formations, and the development of new types of plasma thrusters.

He played an active role in the design and implementation of the "Plasma Coulomb Crystal" experiment conducted aboard the International Space Station (ISS) during the 2015 spaceflight of cosmonaut Aidyn Aimbetov.

Dr. Dosbolayev is the author of over 150 scientific papers published in international peer-reviewed journals and holds 10 innovative patents in Kazakhstan. His h-index is 12.



KazNU scientists are interning in Malaysia

Researchers of the Department of Recreational Geography and Tourism of the Faculty of Geography and Environmental Management of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University are undergoing a scientific internship at the University of Putra Malaysia (UPM).

The KazNU delegation includes senior lecturers Eldar Nuryly and Akmaral Sapieva, PhD student Aida Kalieva, and master's student Dinara Nurkyzy. The internship started on December 3 and will last until December 14. UPM University (Malaysia) is among the top five universities in the country and ranks 148th in the QS World University Rankings 2025.

The visit to UPM began with a tour of the Faculty of Forestry and Environmental Sciences, where KazNU representatives met with the Department of Recreation and ecotourism. They were introduced to Dr. Sam Shor Nahar Yaakob, who spoke about the university's main research areas. The KazNU delegation then visited the research laboratories and learned about the university's educational programs.



On the second day, KazNU staff participated in a unique session organized by the Department of Recreation and Ecotourism at UPM. The outdoor class format allowed them to observe how students apply theory in practice by organizing various recreational activities. The internship participants watched tree climbing, archery, tent pitching, and other activities designed to develop teamwork and leadership skills.

KazNU representatives not only observed the process but also participated, gaining valuable experience to implement into their own educational programs.

The official meeting of the KazNU delegation with UPM leadership followed. KazNU staff presented a report on the scientific and educational activities of the faculty and department, and shared information about the new laboratories and research centers that opened in 2024. In turn, the Malaysian colleagues, with the participation of Dr. Sam Shor Nahar Yaakob, Dr. Noor Jalilah Jumaat, Dr. Mohd Aswad Ramlan, Dr. Zulkhairi Azizi Zainal Abidin, and Dr. Zamru bin Ajuhari, shared their educational and research projects, focusing on sustainable tourism and natural resource conservation. During the discussions, areas for future collaboration were outlined: joint research, grant applications, and the exchange of faculty and students.

The internship program is full of lectures, field seminars and visits to natural heritage sites. One of the key topics during the internship was the lecture "Sustainable tourism and environmental impacts", where the speaker emphasized the importance of developing tourism, which not only brings economic benefits, but also minimizes damage to ecosystems. This approach is consistent with the UN Sustainable Development Goals, including SDG 11 ("Sustainable cities and communities") and SDG 15 ("Conservation of terrestrial ecosystems").

In addition, as part of the internship, KazNU employees will visit the unique Sultan Idris Shah Forestry Education Center, located in a natural forest. This center serves as a base for students' academic practices and research. KazNU delegation is also scheduled to participate in the international conference on adventure and ecotourism 2024 (Hornbill@ICAE) in Miri, organized by UPM.

According to the program, two seminars, field trips and master classes with the participation of KazNU employees are planned after the conference.

KazNU became a part of One Water Vision

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University is the only university in Central Asia that was part of the One Water Vision initiative launched during the One Water Summit.

The International One Water Summit 2024 was held in the capital of Saudi Arabia and was dedicated to discussing global challenges related to water resources management and finding joint solutions at the international level. One Water Vision is a science—based initiative aimed at mobilizing the international scientific community in the field of Earth observation and water management.



Water needs are at the center of the multilateral agenda and international cooperation of the conferences of the parties to the Rio convention on climate, biodiversity and desertification. In view of the need to raise this issue at the level of heads of State and Government, President of the French Republic Emmanuel Macron, President of the Republic of Kazakhstan Kassym-Jomart Tokayev and President of the World Bank Ajay Banga, together with Crown Prince and Prime Minister of Saudi Arabia Mohammed bin Salman, organized the "Single Water Summit". It brought together leading experts, representatives of Governments, international organizations and the scientific community.

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University has joined the One Water Vision initiative, taking an active part in global initiatives related to water resources, promoting the preservation of the Northern Aral Sea. The University is constantly expanding its research base and cooperation with international partners.

The University is actively conducting research activities in the field of monitoring water reserves, surface and groundwater quality, as well as early warning systems about flood risks, which contributes to water resources management, accelerating action on SDG 6 in the field of water and sanitation.

It is worth noting that Shamshagul Mashtaeva, candidate of geographical sciences, senior lecturer at the Faculty of Geography and environmental management, took the initiative to join the Al-Farabi Kazakh National University in the One Water Vision international initiative, which will expand the scope of projects by stimulating partnerships between states, international organizations, local authorities, development banks and private banks, enterprises, charities, scientific experts, SPAs and civil society in line with previous One Planet summits.

KazNU student - winner of OceanMan-2024

A student of the Law Faculty of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, famous athlete Eldar Shekerbek won a bronze medal at the OceanMan-2024 world open water swimming championships.



The final of the world open water swimming championship, which was attended by more than 2,200 athletes from 62 countries, was held in the UAE, in the city of Dubai.

Eldar Shekerbek showed an outstanding result, taking an honorable third place in the 3x500m relay, winning a bronze medal. In addition, Eldar took part in the most prestigious 10km swim, where he finished 5th among 101 participants, despite difficult weather conditions, strong winds and high waves.

Olympic medalists and participants of the world championships took part in the competition, which makes its result especially significant.

Eldar Shekerbek is a two-time world champion, Asian champion, one of the top five swimmers in the world at a distance of 10km in open water, in the age group of 20-29 years.

The Farabi Scientific Library hosted an open seminar by Abel Polese, PhD, Senior Researcher at the Institute of International Settlement and Reconstruction of Dublin City University, on the topic "Strategic thinking in relation to your academic career: developing a publication strategy and finding funding".

Publication activity is a key component of research endeavors, but achieving success in this field takes time. Beyond writing a well-structured article that summarizes research findings, scholars must also identify suitable journals for publication, establish effective communication with editorial boards, and develop a comprehensive strategy for publishing in prestigious global journals included in Scopus.





Abel Polese, PhD, Senior Researcher at the Institute of International Settlement and Reconstruction of Dublin City University devoted his seminar to this relevant and pressing topic.

The event attracted the interest of young scientists, master's and doctoral students, as well as students from KazNU and other universities. The seminar leader was introduced by Bekzhan Meirbayev, Dean of the Faculty of Philosophy and Political Science, PhD in Philosophy, and Associate Professor.



Abel Polese is a Marie Curie Fellow at the Technical University of Dresden (Germany) and the University of Edinburgh (Scotland). He has worked as a policy analyst at the European Commission (DG Research) and served as a visiting professor at several universities across the Americas (Harvard, Toronto, Manizales) and Europe (Paris, Budapest, Dubrovnik, Moscow), among others.

He is the author of Scopus Diaries and The (II) logics of Academic Survival, which explore navigating academic careers. Polese also frequently blogs about the challenges faced by the academic community. The professor's research interests include a wide range of issues on the theory and practice of country development, post-Soviet politics and society, etc. Since 2021, Abel Polese has been teaching the discipline Methodology of research in the social sciences for doctoral students at the Department of Political Science and Political Technologies of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University. He has published six articles in Scopus-indexed journals (Q1 and Q2).

The seminar was held in an engaging form of interactive dialogue. The presenter talked about how to navigate a wide range of scientific publications and make the right choice. He outlined strategies for scholars aiming to publish in Scopus-indexed journals, emphasizing the serious selection process and the paramount importance of quality.

Abel Polese stressed: «Younger scientists often ask me how to get into Scopus, and I always respond: 'Scopus is not a process but a result that comes after substantial scientific work - collecting data, analyzing results, and producing a well-written, structured article. The key to success is, first of all, the quality of the publication, and we must strive for this».

The seminar leader shared many secrets and nuances about a scientist's career such as the commercialization of the fruits of scientific work, motivation and success. At the end of the event, he answered all the questions of the audience in detail, succinctly and with humor manner.
